2016 BENEFIT HONOREE: SHELDON S. HOROWITZ

Tonight's program, "Voices of Hope, Voices of Freedom", consists of eight pieces revolving around the themes of citizenship and the value of life and freedom. The musical genres run the gambit from American gospel and hip-hop, to folk songs and jazz. Some themes in the music dovetail nicely with Voices' 2015-2016 academic component—which studied Hamilton (his life and the musical!), overlooked women in music, and the US election process. (All were part of the middle and high school students' work in writing and reading comprehension.)

Numerous studies have linked music education to improved math and reading skills, an ability to listen and work in teams - and higher emotional well-being. On average, our students spend three hours a day, five to six days a week at Highbridge Voices. Our exceptional staff is committed to fulfilling Voices' mission to provide the students with an experience of excellence - through the music they create together, and through improved academic and life skills. Over the years we have found that the two program components complement one another; the joy and fun that comes from choral singing – makes the "medicine" of more academics and life choice discussions easier to swallow.

This year's graduating seniors, Roselyn Lopez and Amanda Rivera have been with Voices since fourth grade – and both will be attending 4-year colleges this fall. Also in the audience tonight is Robert Cortijo, a Voices alum, who graduated in May with a BS in Criminology from Dominican College. We are so proud of them!

So, on that happy note – sit back and feel the joy! (And on behalf of the Highbridge Voices' Board of Trustees –many, many heartfelt thanks!)





the world. As a member of the Highbridge Voices family, she enjoys every minute with her students and her biggest reward is to witness the transformation that music can create in young singers.


David SeeCollaborative Pianist

David graduated with a Bachelor of Music in Composition in 1979 from Oberlin Conservatory. He lives with his wife Lynn in Washington Heights.





THE MUSIC PROGRAM

he Highbridge Voices music program gives students a comprehensive and dynamic music education. With choir rehearsals, music theory, music history, sight-reading, eartraining, and voice lessons, the focus is not just on giving performances, but creating lifelong musicians who under-



stand the value of an arts education, and will continue to participate in music in college and beyond.

Our fourth, fifth, and sixth grade students learn the basics of healthy singing and music literacy. In their voice classes, they learn how to sit, stand, breathe, and use their voice as singers. They learn to follow their voice part in a piece of music—no easy task, even for adults!—and they develop their rhythm and pitch skills. Using the Kodály solfege system, our youngest singers learn how to sing short, five-note melodies, and are able to compose their own melodies as well. They take these skills into their choir rehearsals, and work on

two- and three-part music in several languages. They have sung in English, Spanish, Latin, Swahili, German, and Portuguese.

Our older students, in seventh through twelfth grade, work on advancing their singing skills, while also becoming well-versed in music theory

and music history. In their individual voice lessons, they focus on what their voices are able to do and how to develop healthy singing habits. They go over parts of the choir repertoire that they might find difficult, and prepare for solo performances. They continue to develop their music literacy skills, reading in treble and bass clef, and deciphering key signatures and complex time

signatures. They begin work on piano, percussion, and guitar. The students also examine the historical and cultural context of the music they are performing, while also learning about music's influence in today's culture.

Of course, after graduation, it is up to each student to decide what role music will play in their adult life. Many continue to sing with their college, community, or church choir. Our hope is that they continue to allow music to be a positive part of their lives. ighbridge Voices supports students as they strive for excellence in academics. There are four primary components of the Academic Program: math instruction, English language arts (ELA) instruction, tutoring, and homework assistance. It is our belief that additional academic instruction

and support will enable our students not only to imagine their futures, but also to master the skills and knowledge necessary to make their goals a reality.

We believe that our students deserve rigorous academic and musical programs that complement each other. Each week, students receive up to four hours of additional academic instruction.

Both our math and ELA curricula are aligned with the Common Core Standards so that students can gain access to a 21st Century education and acquire the literacy and mathematical skills necessary to be successful. One-on-one tutoring is now offered to all Highbridge students as well.

Math and English Language Arts instruction are provided to our fourth, fifth, and sixth grade students. This year we instituted two new electives, Women in Film and Mirrors in the Movies, diversifying an already robust program. Students also created the second edition of the Highbridge Voices Literary Magazine, re-created the American election

process, and wrote an original musical. We try to differentiate our offerings with fun and engaging projects and activities that might not be available at school. Our summer high school program on issues of race and identity included a field trip to the Statue of Liberty and Ellis Island. Also, our younger students



competed in the annual "Math Olympics" with help from a group of volunteers. Overall, our students consistently outperform their peers academically on both state and standardized tests, as well as in their grade point averages.

Highbridge Voices prepares its high school students for their Regents and SAT Exams. Our graduating seniors were both accepted to numerous four-year colleges, and our junior is already deeply involved with her college prepactivities. Highbridge Voices hopes that through our program, students learn the academic and life skills necessary to blaze their own paths in life.




