


In 2013 he began focusing on a mix of activities including advising entrepreneurs and start-up companies. He also works with young people as they launch into their working lives and adulthood.

elcome friends and families to the 2017 Highbridge Voices Benefit Concert!

Tonight's program, *A Life of Song*, honors the role music plays in our lives and throughout the world. As someone who still hums refrains from my ninth grade choir repertoire, I am struck by the breadth of music (and thereby, human experience) our Highbridge Voices' students learn-and make their own. Our Winter Concert was more traditional-with beautiful Bach, Haydn and Gabriel Faure. Tonight, the children will bring us contemporary and global pieces touching on courage, love, sorrow and passion. We will hear a Field Yell from the American South, an African children's song, a French madrigal, a Japanese song of fireflies, and a gospel rendition of a Maya Angelou poem!

The mission of Highbridge Voices is to inspire excellence and learn life skills through participation in a high quality choir program. Extensive choir work is supplemented with academic enrichment and college prep-plus field trips to NYC museums, summer Shakespeare in the Park, and such customized English Language Art classes as The Jazz Age and The Musical Origins of Rock n Roll. This year the annual Spring trip took thirty, eager Bronx teens to Memphis and Nashville-where they performed for the local TV networks, ate barbecue, and learned to two-step at a dance hall. They were very well received, incredibly well comported-and made the Highbridge staff (and their parents!!) quite proud.

The latest research in youth development has found that young people learn best when they feel a connection to, and see their own reflection in, the work that they do. The recent book, *The Power of Music: Pioneering Discoveries in the New Science of Song,* explores neurological findings about the role of music in human health-stimulating more parts of the brain than any other human function and allowing listeners and performers to be connected simultaneously and physically to each other through our ear drums. Interestingly, artificial intelligence experts have also posited that the ability to create and perform evocative music may be one of the few, uniquely human endeavors. So, pulling all that together–may the fruits of the composers we hear tonight–reflected through the hard work and strong young voices of the 100+ children from Highbridge, Bronx, USA–bring us all an hour of enjoyment and an appreciation for our unique, beautiful and connected humanity!

A special call out to this year's graduating seniors, Sadia and Lee-and heartfelt thanks to our 2017 co-chairs and to so many of you in the audience who have supported Highbridge Voices over many years! On behalf of the Highbridge Voices' Board of Trustees, thank you for your loyalty, enthusiasm, and generosity. We couldn't do it without you!





Mary has led Highbridge Voices' Chamber Choir in several high-profile performances, including a concert for the Justices of the United States Supreme Court, a performance of the National Anthem at Yankee Stadium, and a concert for recording artist and producer will.i.am.

Mary has served as a guest clinician and adjudicator in schools in Virginia, Maryland, and Wisconsin. She is also the Metropolitan Region Representative of the New York chapter of the American Choral Directors Association and

was a 2014 International Conducting Fellow in Hangzhou, China. She received her Master of Music Education degree at Florida State University in Tallahassee, and her Bachelor of Music degree at St. Olaf College in Northfield, Minnesota.

SunHee joined Highbridge Voices as a voice instructor in 2010, and she now serves as Associate Music Director and conducts the Concert Choir, a 55-voice ensemble of students in grades 4-6.

SunHee received her M.M. in Choral Conducting at Westminster Choir College in Princeton and her B.M. in Voice Performance with Secondary Education Teaching Certificate at Catholic University of Daegu, South Korea. Before she came to the States, she served as an assistant music director for the youth choir Pueri Cantores in South Korea and also performed extensively in choral works around the world. As a member of the Highbridge Voices family, she

enjoys every minute with her students, and her biggest reward is to witness the transformation that music can create in young singers.

Billy is a conductor, teacher, and songwriter. Billy is the Founder and Artistic Director of Tapestry, a professional choral ensemble. Tapestry has earned praise for being a sensitive, artistic ensemble, and has had a number of notable performances, including a ballet at Alvin Ailey American Dance Theater, and a performance with the internationally known Australian Voices. Billy also serves as the Program and Music Director of Basilica Voices, a children's choir at The Basilica of Saint Patrick's Old Cathedral, and as director of the Columbia University Glee Club. He has also been a conductor and singer in C4: The Choral Composer Conductor Collective. Billy has taught at Highbridge Voices, Sacred Heart School

in The Bronx, and The Cape Music Institute in Cape Town, South Africa. He holds a Bachelor of Arts in Voice and a Bachelor of Science in Music Education from the University of Connecticut, and is pursuing a Master of Music in Choral Conducting at the Manhattan School of Music.

David See has had a varied career as piano teacher, collaborative pianist (for instrumentalists, singers and musical theater), composer/arranger, keyboardist for stage and rock bands, and organist. 

THE MUSIC PROGRAM

he Highbridge Voices Music Program aims to provide students with a varied and comprehensive music education. With choir rehearsals, music theory, music history, sight-reading, ear-training, and voice lessons, our mission is to create life-long musicians who understand the value of an arts



education, and how training in the arts can benefit them in college and beyond.

Our fourth, fifth, and sixth grade students learn the basics of healthy singing and music literacy. In their voice classes, they learn how to sit, stand, breathe, and use their voices as singers. They learn to follow their voice parts in a piece of music—no easy task, even for adults!—and they develop their rhythm and pitch skills. Using the Kodály solfege system, our youngest singers learn how to sing short, five-note melodies, and are able to compose their own melodies as well. They take these skills into their choir rehearsals, and work on two- and three-part music in several languages. This year alone they have sung in English, Latin, German, Swahili, and Japanese.

Our older students, in seventh through twelfth grade, work on advancing their singing skills, while also becoming well-versed in music theory and music history. In their individual

> voice lessons, they focus on what their voices are able to do and how to develop healthy singing habits. They go over parts of the choir repertoire that they might find difficult, and prepare for solo performances. They continue to develop their music literacy skills, reading in treble and bass clef, and deciphering key signatures and complex time signatures. They begin work on piano,

percussion, and guitar. The students also examine the historical and cultural context of the music they are performing, while learning about music's influence in today's culture. Classes and seminars on women's often overlooked role in music history were offered this year, and the annual spring tour went through Memphis and Nashville, two famed music locales.

Of course, after graduation, it is up to each student to decide what role music will play in their adult life. Many continue to sing with their college, community, or church choir. Our hope is that they continue to allow music to be a positive part of their lives.

THE ACADEMIC PROGRAM

The Academic Program at Highbridge Voices supports students as they strive for scholastic excellence. There are four primary components of the Academic Program: math instruction, English language arts (ELA) instruction, tutoring, and homework assistance. It is our belief

that additional academic enrichment will enable our students to imagine futures where their professional and personal aspirations can turn into realities.

Each week, students receive up to four hours of academic instruction. Both our math and ELA curriculums are aligned with the New York State Common Core Standards so that students can gain the literacy and mathematical skills necessary to

be successful in the 21st century. Oneon-one tutoring is offered to all Highbridge students as well. High school students also have special prep sessions for their Regents and SAT Exams.


This year we introduced five new electives, including classes on artistic trends during times of war, a close study of 20th century songs and songwriters, and a social science class that examined the mysteries of human behavior. Before the school year ends, students will also release the third edition of the Highbridge Voices Literary Magazine, hold their second student election, and record original songs using Garage Band in our professionally equipped studio. We distinguish our academic offerings with fun and engaging projects and activities that might not be available at school. For example, last year's summer high school program focused on students finding their own creative voices and included a trip to the Louis Armstrong House Museum in Flushing, Queens. In



April, our younger students competed in the annual Math Olympics, which featured a catapult challenge. These kinds of experiences keep our students coming back year after year.

Highbridge Voices students consistently outperform their District 9 peers on state standardized exams and grade point average. Our two graduating seniors, Lee and Sadia, have both been accepted to numerous colleges, and our junior, Kareem, is already deeply involved with his college prep activities. Highbridge Voices hopes that through our program, students gain the academic and social skills necessary to blaze their own paths in life.

Congratulations to all the wonderful students and teachers who make Highbridge Voices the great program it has become. We are honored to be a part of such a wonderful organization.
