### 2018 EMCEE: JEANNIE GAFFIGAN

ctress, producer, writer, philanthropist, mother of five and all around comedic force Jeannie Gaffigan is most well-known for the comedy empire she created with her writing and producing partner as well as husband, Jim Gaffigan, one of the world's premiere standup comedians and actors. Called "Comedy's Quietest Power Couple," by *Vanity Fair*, Jeannie and Jim have developed a critically acclaimed TV show, written bestselling books, and produced multiple sold out tours and platinum status comedy albums.

Recently, Jeannie was executive producer and writer on the TV Land comedy "The Jim Gaffigan Show." The show was well received by critics, with *Newsday* proclaiming it as "A must see comedy smash," *People Magazine* calling it "One of TV's bright spots," and The Los Angeles Times calling the show, "Fun and Funny."

Last year, Gaffigan directed her husband's Netflix comedy special "Cinco", which premiered in January 2017 and has directed his upcoming special, "Noble Ape" due out July 2018.

The first comedy special Jeannie co-wrote and executive produced



was 2006's "Beyond the Pale," which achieved Platinum sales for CD and DVD. Next was the highly successful "King Baby" in 2009, which she co-wrote, executive produced, and wrote the opening sequence in the special directed by Troy Miller. She also helped co-write and executive produce Jim Gaffigan's latest comedy specials, "Mr. Universe" in 2012 and "Obsessed" in 2014. Jeannie was also the story editor for Jim's books, *Dad Is Fat* and *FOOD: A Love Story*, two *New York Times* best sellers.

In addition to performing in theater, film and television, Jeannie was the founder and executive director of "Shakespeare on the Playground," a not-for-profit theater company that produced Shakespearean plays for inner city teenagers with a focus on literacy and production skills. She lives in New York with Jim and their five children.

oi and Sheldon Horowitz reside in New City, New York with their 3 children, Jason, Lexi and Brett. Sheldon is President of Safe Harbour Group, Ltd, an insurance agency in New City. Joi and Sheldon are Bronx natives. They are strong proponents of Highbridge Voices.

Sheldon has been intricately involved with the Highbridge organization for many years. He was the 2016 honoree at the Highbridge Voices Benefit Concert. Sheldon has served on the board of multiple regional and national not-for-profit



organizations, including: the American Heart Association, Rockland County Historical Society, Helen Hayes Hospital Foundation, New City Rotary, Rockland County Sheriff's Reserve Force, and the Monmouth University Business Council.

Joi and Sheldon are commit-

ted to promoting education. They have established and funded multiple scholarships. They created the Robert H. Finkelstein Memorial Scholarship in honor of Sheldon's business partner who passed away in 2001. Joi and Sheldon instituted the Howard S. Cohen Memorial Scholarship at Monmouth University School of Real Estate and the Gisela and Bernard Dolinger Scholarship at Monmouth University. They also assisted their son Jason who created the Christopher J. Mejia Endowed Memorial scholarship, also at Monmouth University. Sheldon also sits on the Monmouth University School of Business Scholarship Committee and is the chairman of the New City Rotary Scholarship Committee, which awards scholarships to welldeserving college bound students. appy Twentieth Anniversary, Highbridge Voices!! And a warm welcome to all of our friends and supporters and to the families of the wonderful Highbridge Voices students!

Tonight we are celebrating three people: Mr. Jorge Batista, Monsignor Donald Sakano, and Mr. Bruno Casolari. Twenty years ago, these men had the vision and energy to establish an after-school choral program in the basement level of a few Highbridge Community Development Corporation buildings on Merriam Avenue in the Bronx. The buildings themselves had been burned down to their studs during the fiscal and spiritual crisis of New York City in the late 1970s – and Mr. Batista and Monsignor Sakano were instrumental during the 1980s in helping to execute NYC's housing rebuilding program under Mayor Koch. No sooner were the buildings repaired and rented out to low and middle-income families, than Monsignor turned to Bruno Casolari, his parish's organist and the director of the Summer Youth Theater at Purchase College to do something in music for the children of the Highbridge community.

The mission of Highbridge Voices has always been to inspire excellence and to teach life skills through participation in a high-quality choir program supplemented with academic support. The program accepts children in fourth grade and provides after-school enrichment five days a week through graduation from high school. A few new students are accepted in fifth grade, and while some leave in high school due to other interests and time demands, most of our singers are with the program for eight years. Your support helps us to provide them with a full range of programs including: excellent and increasingly complex choir training, math and English language classes, tutoring, and college prep classes and admissions support (including summer essay writing workshops).

Additionally, the program includes enrichment activities throughout New York City, New York State and across the United States. Each summer they have a New York City-focused arts program for the high schoolers, and all seventh through twelfth graders who meet our attendance and grade criteria take a Spring trip each year – this year to Saratoga Springs and Quebec – last year Memphis and Nashville – in prior years, San Francisco and Palo Alto.

In addition to our honorees, I want to extend heartfelt thanks on behalf of the children, their families, the staff, and the entire board, to all of you who have supported this program so generously over the past few years and decades. We truly could not do it without your loyalty, enthusiasm, and generosity. Thank you so much and please enjoy tonight's show!

### Mary Clementi • Executive & Music Director



Mary Clementi is the Executive Director and Music Director of Highbridge Voices. As music director, Mary conducts the Chamber Choir, a 26-voice ensemble of students in grades 7-9, and co-conducts the Highbridge Singers, a 26-voice ensemble of students in grades 8-12. Mary has led Highbridge Voices in several high-profile performances, including a concert for the Justices of the United States Supreme Court, a televised performance at the Apollo Theater, and a performance of "The Star Spangled Banner" at Madison Square Garden.

Mary has served as a guest clinician and adjudicator

in schools in Virginia, Maryland, and Wisconsin. She was a 2014 International Conducting Fellow in Hangzhou, China. She received her Master of Music Education degree at Florida State University in Tallahassee, and her Bachelor of Music degree at St. Olaf College in Northfield, Minnesota.

### **SunHee Lim** • Associate Music Director



SunHee joined Highbridge Voices as a voice instructor in 2010 and now serves as Associate Music Director. SunHee conducts the Concert Choir, a 56-voice ensemble of students in grades 4-6, and co-conducts the Highbridge Singers.

SunHee received her Master of Music degree in Choral Conducting at Westminster Choir College in Princeton and her Bachelor of Music degree in Voice Performance with Secondary Education Teaching Certificate at Catholic University of Daegu, South Korea. Before she came to the States, she served as an assistant music director for the youth

choir Pueri Cantores in South Korea and also performed extensively in choral works around the world.

### Jim Funnell • Collaborative Pianist



Jim Funnell is a jazz pianist/keyboardist and composer. He leads his own ensemble, with which he has released two albums (*Word Out* and *Spirit of the Snail*) and won the Composition Prize at the "Trophées du Sunside" in Paris. Jim also co-founded AfuriKo, a colorful and atypical African infused jazz duo, with percussionist Akiko Horii. The unit has produced two albums since 2014 (*On the Far Side* and *Style*), both of which were chosen to receive full funding from SACEM (French Society of Authors, Composers, and Music Publishers).

Since graduating from Berklee College of Music, which he attended on a full tuition scholarship, Jim has been active as an educator, teaching both privately and in workshop/masterclass settings. Jim is currently working on a third AfuriKo release and gearing up for a European tour this summer.

he Highbridge Voices music program aims to provide students with a varied and comprehensive music education. With choir rehearsals. music theory, music history, sight-reading, ear-training, and voice lessons, our mission is to create life-long musicians who understand the value of an arts eduthrough twelfth grade, work on advancing their singing skills, while also becoming well-versed in music theory and music history. In their individual voice lessons, they focus on what their voices are able to do and how to develop healthy singing habits. They go over parts of the choir repertoire that they

might find difficult, and prepare for solo performances. They continue to develop their music literacy skills, reading in treble and bass clef, and deciphering key signatures and complex time signatures in music theory. 




